

The Governing Body at 1st September 2017

The governing body re-constituted on the 3rd April, 2014. The majority of governors in a Catholic school such as St Eugene de Mazenod are Foundation Governors, appointed in the name of the Archbishop of Westminster. Foundation Governors have a legal duty to preserve and develop the Catholic character of the school and to ensure that the school is conducted in accordance with its Trust Deed.
