A reminder about punctuality - Please make sure that your child is on time for school every day. Children are often upset and embarrassed when they come into school late, this means that they don't begin their day well and this can make them feel very unsettled and unhappy. They are also missing very important learning time. At the beginning of the day:

- **Reception, Year 1 and 2 children read to an adult and develop their comprehension skills**
- **In Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 children respond to the teachers marking by improving and correcting their English and maths from the day before. This shows the children what they need to do to progress in their learning.**
