## Being safe on the internet, an important reminder...

### Please read these guidelines to ensure your children are safe.

The responsibility for keeping children safe online lies with parents and carers. It is not a child's responsibility to protect themselves, but of course as parents and teachers we teach children about what to do if they feel unsafe online.

Electronic devices should be used in communal areas; an adult should be present when children are using any device that connects to the internet.

Children should only be communicating online with people they know.

Parents should have access to children's online accounts, including their usernames and passwords.

Children should be 13 years and older to upload to YouTube.

Children should be 13 years and older to participate in most social media sites e.g. Snapchat
