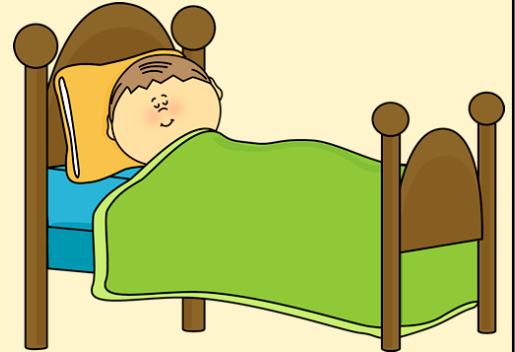

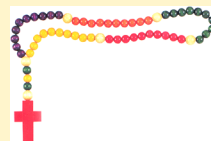


## Our prayer...

Martino included all of the key facts about Nelson Mandela. He organised the biography in a logical manner. He used a variety of sentences in his writing which made it interesting to read.

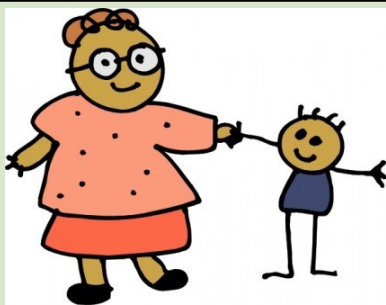
